President's Report

As we see more and more of our northern friends heading back, I wish you safe travels and the hope that I see you all next fall. We are not the same Village without you.

There has been a lot of talk around about reserves, whether we are covered under Senate Bill 4D or not. I am fortunate enough to receive a copy of Community – The Official Journal of Community Associations Institute West Florida Chapter. The March issue addresses this in their article on "Nationwide Legislation regarding structural integrity and condo safety". I know you are saying not us, but please read the words of our Florida SB4D which has passed.

"SB4D: Building safety, was signed into law in May of 2022. The Bill established statewide structural integrity reserve study and funding requirements for condominium associations and cooperatives. It also establishes requirements for periodic Milestone Inspections."

The very next page in the magazine, entitled "Florida Legislative Update" is an article "A note from CAI FLA: Update on 4D".

It states: "The passing of Senate Bill 4D left many questions and concerns with community association boards, managers and industry professionals. The Community Association's Institute's Florida Legislative Alliance (CAI-FLA) has created a council dedicated to understanding the new bill and advocating for changes to improve the impact for community association members and leaders.

The proposals include wording that better defines the term "story" as it pertains to the height of subject buildings, clarifies the term "coastline" and resolves questions surrounding the SIRS items and other areas of impact from the new law." (SIRS – roof, floor, load bearing walls, fireproofing & amp; fire safety, exterior painting & amp; water proofing, plumbing, electrical systems, foundation, windows and other elements over \$10,000 that have an impact on the structural integrity of the building)

As you can see there are many questions on the bill. Some say, it does not include us, we have no three-story buildings. Others say the law says "structural integrity reserve study and funding requirements.", include us as the word and is used, we do not need a structural integrity reserve study, but will be covered under "funding requirements". Some say it only covers condos, but others say the word "and" is used again and we are covered under "cooperatives".

We will be having a reserve study done in late June or early July. At that time, we will have updated costs of items listed in the reserve study and have a greater understanding of what will be needed in the next budget for reserves. Please remember the reserve budget is different than the operating budget. We have no idea when this law will be in effect. However, we must take every precaution to make sure we are covering our reserve responsibility and not to need a special assessment to bring us up to par when the bill does go into effect and if we are included. We will follow the reserve study responsibility, including the number of years and amounts they suggest.

As you can see this is a very complicated law and if attorneys do not agree you can understand your board's dilemma.

April Rule Reminder

Rule #3 – MULTI-UNIT OWNERSHIP; RENTALS

- A. No Resident whether Shareholder or Non-Shareholder, or Non-Resident may, solely or jointly own more than one unit in El Rancho Village, titled or untitled, unless that resident or non-resident is buying a second unit and commences and continues to make a bona fide effort to sell either unit with a Real Estate Agent. The second unit may be purchased for the purpose of upgrading and eventual sale. Upgrading must include residing, if not already sided. No more than one additional unit may be purchased for this purpose until the graded unit is sold. Lot rent on units that are originally owned by the Corporation and are sold to a resident for the purpose of upgrading may have the lot rent waived while the unit is being upgraded. Any rent waivers would be at the discretion of the Board. To this rule, the term "unit" shall include the mobile home and leasehold interest as well as a mobile home located on a lot owned by the Corporation.
- B. Mobile Homes may be sublet under the following conditions:
 - 1. Only one rental allowed per year.
 - 2. Minimum rental is three (3) months.
 - 3. Maximum rental is six (6) months.
 - 4. Prospective renters **MUST BE INTERVIEWED AND APPROVED** by the Park Manager in the same manner as prospective buyers as provided in Section 16A of the El Rancho village, Inc. Master Proprietary Lease. Failure of a prospective renter to be pre-approved will subject the Member/Shareholder to the penalties provided in the Master Form Proprietary Lease, including but not limited to removal of the tenant and termination of the Member's membership share.
 - 5. All Renters are subject to the same Rules and Regulations as the Mobile Homeowners.
 - 6. All rents or assessments (maintenance fees) **MUST BE CURRENT** prior to entering into any rental agreement.




