

President's Report





Hope the ghosts and goblins did not play too much havoc on all of you last month!

Things are going pretty well here in the Village. Our northern friends are beginning to return, the weather is a little cooler, and we are moving onward with the selling of the Village.

The Chatter articles may sound redundant at times, but we are in such an important part of the acquisition, I feel information needs to be posted more than once, as some only attend meetings, some only read the Chatter, and some only read email blasts. We need to cover all bases!

The Executive Committee of the Board (which includes the President, Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary) are meeting twice a month with our Manager, our Attorney, his team, and MHM in the final stages of the sale. I will summarize those meetings in all venues of communication to you.

Here is my summary of our first meeting on October 6, 2023:

Information from meeting with MHM, Lawyers, Executive Committee and Manager of VOTG

The meeting was very scattered, no agenda.

- ▶ Bob Miller started by explaining how these phone calls are getting us closer to closing, we are going uphill (in other words in gathering all materials and inspections) and once the due diligence period is over it is downhill with closing.
- ▶ These calls will hopefully accomplish two things:
 - 1. Assignment of responsibility on what is needed to be done.
 - 2. Communication on a regular basis between all parties.
- ▶ Due Diligence this is a 60-day period when they declare it to start (which according to Jonathan and Bob has not started yet). We have submitted everything requested and we are waiting on one more thing from the insurance company. These things were sent to Julia (MHM) and Jonathan did not realize it had been submitted. I suggested to Dean he copy everyone (Jonathan, Bob, Paul) when submitting things to Julia. We are hoping that the 60-day period starts within the next couple of weeks once everyone gets their updated things from each other. During due diligence period, shareholders packets will be prepared to their special specification of amount owed (water/sewer, mortgage, liens etc.) to be taken out of their \$200,000. We will also have the signing of the shareholder packets during this period. More inspections.

- ▶ Title searches have been started and it is overwhelming. Jonathan was asked to check with title company to see where they are in the process. It is my understanding due diligence does not start until all title searches (556) have been completed.
- ▶ The first amendment to the PSA will be the schedules/ exhibits that were left blank in PSA we signed.
- ▶ Escrow deposit has been made.
- ▶ 723 residents it was discussed that the 723 residents (now) should have a lease that would protect them regarding rent increases, etc. This would be a new prospectus for them also.
- ▶ Closing found that the title company does no closings in the last two weeks of December and first week of January.
- Checks -We will, in all probability, receive our checks in January or February 2024. Remember we need to agree on closing date, and I will make sure that all (excluding those being held in escrow for any reason) have their checks in time to pay higher rent.

Our coffee hours are going to start beginning the first and third Saturday of each month this month and I hope to see you all there.

I also want to take this time to wish you all a very Happy Thanksgiving. It is hard sometimes to be thankful for the things we have, and not dwell on what we do not have. We are blessed and I just want to leave you with this:



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
