I hope everyone has had a Merry Christmas, Happy Hanukkah, and a Happy New Year so far. For those of you in the park "WELCOME BACK HOME!" Now you are anxiously awaiting the closing and

ready to get your check from the sale of your share. "Show Me the Money!" Hopefully, you made a New Year's Resolution to use the profits wisely. Not every day can you make that kind of return on your investment.

As Donna mentioned several times, we will be repeating some things because of the importance and different venues (Email, Facebook, VOTG website and Chatter). LAUNDRY

This is still true to this day. The problem is with the number of shareholders we have. I have a friend who works in the mortgage business, and she is telling me that to do a search on 556 titles would be enormous and she really did not know of many title companies that would take on such a project. Mr. Miller indicated that there were only two title companies in the State that would. This has been a big hold-up for us. Of course, the holidays are a challenging time to get things done also, as offices are closed, have limited hours and the like. So, as we begin this new year, my goal is to work as hard as I can, without cutting any corners and get this done. (Goal: within the first quarter of 2024)
- 2. To be more "present" in the Village. You all know how to reach me, I try to be accessible to each and everyone who shows up at my door, calls, text, or emails. I try to give all the time to speak at the meetings (yes, 2 minutes, but you can come back after everyone else has spoken). However, I have heard through the grapevine that I am unreachable! best solution. Here are some reminders when using the Laundry: Please do not leave either washers or dryers you are using unattended. This prevents other people from using the machines and bottlenecks the process. Do not forget to clean the lint filters after EVERY use. Thank you!

WATER & SEWER

The Water and Sewer project is over except for possibly one or two problem areas. For the most part they have done a fantastic job. We know that no job is perfect, but they really tried to deal with everyone fairly and did over and above what their contract called for. Thank you, FPS!

LAWNCARE

J & S Landscaping is a business and must be able to function as such. Lawncare is increased to \$36 per month on January 1st. I am told that is about average for mobile home parks. If you do cancel your service, you will not be able to restart with them until January 2025. There are other landscape companies that service the park. No matter who you use, I have a master list that I use when I ride the park. Sometimes, I will call your vendor and see if there is a problem before contacting you, the resident with pictures. The main thing I need to know is who does your lawn and who does your weeding. Summer comes and rainy season brings fast growing grass and weeds...

SALES

Stacy, our Broker has several pending sales for after the closing with the park is over. One of the big hurdles is not knowing what the lot rent will be once MHM takes over. We are now complete. So, after the sale it will be:

> \$635 monthly for the shareholders, \$695 monthly for non-shareholders and \$895 monthly for new residents.

or if there is a group of you (we can use the conference room, just make sure you let me know there will be a group so I can reserve the conference room). This might make you all feel I am reachable.

Update regarding the sale: (please remember this is being written on or before December 10th and I am sure you have heard it and consider it old news, but I told you I would be repeating as many times as it takes, and I am sure there has been updates given to you by the time this is published!

Due Diligence: The due diligence period began on November 22, 2023. We were told this during a meeting on November 30 with MHM on Rules and Regulations. However, it has been pointed out to us by the attorney and MHM that we might have to ask for an extension of the 60-day period. Now we as a board and manager will do everything in our power to make sure things required on our end are done, but we must realize some things are out of our hands (such as the packets being made for each shareholder to address them personally after title search, the title searches themselves, any inspections).

Title Searches: It looks as if these will not be completed until mid-December per discussion at this meeting. Taking them longer than expected.

Age Verification: We were happy to report that we are only missing nine (9) residents copy of a driver's license in our files. We will work to obtain those nine.

Rules and Regulations: A meeting was held on Thursday, November 30 to go over the rules and regulations that the board passed in August to be sent to MHM and the attorney for legal clarification. There are a great number of items that need to be worded differently (legally), as well as some new legislation that needs to be incorporated. These rules will be included in the new prospectus for both the 723 and 721 residents. Those notes will be sent to the attorney and will await his draft for our review. They were pleased with the work that the Rules and Regulations Committee has done thus far.

Market Rent: This is being finalized by MHM and should have something for us by the end of next week for us to pass on to the realtor.

Prospectus: (723 – non-shareholder). A new prospectus and lease will be written for the 723 residents. The wording is very old in the current prospectus and the legislation has changed, which needs to be addressed.

(721 – shareholder) This will outline the things we agreed to in the LOI and along with the lease we sign, will insure us of our terms.



We will play until mid-April, longer if players are available. So come check it out and join in the fun!!




