The total solar eclipse on April 8 is causing such a stir because the rare event — where the shadow of the moon will plunge a narrow strip of land into darkness in the middle of the day — is an astro-



nomical experience like no other that will be unusually accessible to millions of people. The sky is filled with breathtaking wonders, but one occurring on April 8 is causing people to plan trips in droves, prompting fears of snarled highways and generating headline after headline.

April's total solar eclipse will fall over more places in the U.S. than the total eclipse before and after it. And the broad length of the path of totality, where Americans have the best shot of getting a clear view, is "much wider" than it was for the eclipse in 2017, according to the National Aeronautics and Space Administration. III. RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS:

An application for residency must be completed and approved prior to occupancy. Applicants must read the Rules and Regulations, then sign and date an agreement to abide by them prior to occupancy.

<u>Seasonal renters</u> or anyone that is going to live in the Park must apply before:

- A. Arrival of the Resident's manufactured home in the Community.
- B. The transfer of title when the home is already in the Community.

Anyone that is going to live here or goes on the Deed will be subject to a background and credit check. El Rancho Village reserves the right to refuse admission to anyone who purchases or otherwise receives title to a manufactured home that has not been approved by Park Management.

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

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


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
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APRIL CROSSWORD PUZZLE
